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# Our Local BBBS and Macy's Partnership Goes National

The Macy's-BBBS Holiday Breakfast began in 2010 with a small group of about 20 Littles and Bigs and family members at their Jensen Beach location. The Littles are then presented with their gift bag, including a \$50 Macy's gift card funded by the retailer's corporate granting program.

After the success of the Macy's-BBBS Holiday Breakfast in Jensen Beach, other stores in Palm Beach County, FL, joined in, bringing the number of hosting stores from five to six and expanding the reach of children served from a single store to the entire region. # The Children's Services Council of Martin County Empowers Youth Potential by Funding Mentoring Programs!

The Children's Services Council of Martin County has provided the resources for Martin County children and youth to take part in a variety of mentoring programs that empowers kids to stay on track to graduate with a plan for their future and a mentor whose impact lasts a lifetime.

To address the lack of social-emotional learning children and youth are connected to a mentor and engage them in collaborative activities, which make learning and social-emotional growth fun. The following programs are funded through the Children's Services Council of Martin County. The "Start Something" program is community-based mentoring that pairs kids with a caring adult who provides friendship and positive experiences to support children and youth in learning and developing new skills for a brighter future.

"School to Work" is a unique online mentoring program that integrates one-to-one mentoring, career exploration, and life skills development to inspire high schoolaged youth to set goals and make plans for their future beyond school.


